Dear Sir :

I have received your letter of Aug.29th. I have also seen your son and am very sorry that he struck me at a time when I had about 12 new teachers on hand and the office was full every minute and we got little chance to be even decent to him. I could not help it, however.

I think it quite probable that you will get the things you asked for to be sent in on the first boat next year. Mr/Lopp is reserving some money from the current fund, and of course you understand that he will be able to do much more after next July first.

I have notice of your appointment, so presume you have received it by this time . Mr/ Lopp is able to do little for anyone this year.

I am glad to hear that you have almost cleared up Henrys business. You should inform him that you are to hold his deer until my next arrival at Deering, when we will take the matter up.

You will be surprised to see your brother on this mail boat. I do hope that you will get a chance to talk to him.
