



Dear Sir:

Telegram just received authorizing for lighterage at Deering and Sinuk freight \$110.00.

When you were here I asked you to let me know what was the rate per ton from Teller to the different points, also what steamer the supplies were carried on. With this information I could figure out how much is due from each of my authorizations, and I could then authorize you to pay these freights if they were payable at Nome, or you send the vouchers down here and we would pay them.

If the lighterage at Deering is from the village to the school then they require special authorization chargeable to local expense, but if it is the lighterage from ship's tackle to the shore then it is payable from my authorizations, but I must know the rate per ton in order to authorize the proper amount to cover. Kindly give me this information by return boat if possible so that I can figure this freight and lighterage and make proper
