I enclose a bid issued by the S. S.Corwin which gives the rates for delivering freight from Teller to Wales, Shishmaref and Kotzebue. It may be of service to you in settle-ing up with the Corwin.

The lighterage of the Government sumplies at Deering was for delivery of Goods from the village to the Gov. school. The exact amount is \$70.75. I will hold the woucher here and upon authority received from you will pay. I supposed that you would be able to wire me authority and when the voucher arrived at Seattle, on its way to Washington, that you could make the proper entries relative to the accounts that it should be charged against. I trust that you have the B / L.

As the B / L Sinuk supplies has been forwarded by the Senator' I can not give you the exact figure for the delivery of these supplies from Teller to Sinuk. However the rate is \$8.00 per ton and if you will send me a properly made out voucher I will have it signed and paid here. I am not sure that a voucher has already been forwarded for I was unable to find out whether the Sinuk teacher gave the Capt. of the "New Jersey" anything to show that the goods had been delivered. The new teacher, Miss Hill had not arrived when the goods were delivered and Miss Ellis was not under appointment. Miss Hill checked the goods and mailed the signed B/L.
