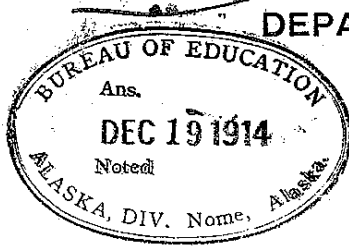

Dear Mr. Shields:

Am enclosing such blanks as can be spared, keeping only a few for this station.

We heard nothing more of the proposed meet of the Eskimo at Igloo, but concluded that you had not finished the details yet.

As the time grows shorter until our moving time we grow more anxious to be off.

I have been quite ill for two weeks and am hardly able to be in the school-room now, but I feel that I must not lose any time this winter at any rate.

We have filled the Cold-Storage and made a contract with the store people to handle the meat at a given price for one year; I enclose a copy of the contract.

I have taken Henry's deer completely away from him and have employed a man to care for them and will pay him apprentice's wages from the herd. Have settled with Stanley in full \$458.80. and taken his receipt. Have a few bills yet to settle and am awaiting word from you as to further action.

We are rather anxious for a conference with you on the future move to Noorvik, and are getting ready as far as we feel it is safe to proceed at this time. We value your judgment and hope to have it free.

The village enthusiastically awaits the moving time, and the coming of Mr. Shields is looked for with delight by the native as well as by yours truly,
