Dear Sir:

Enclosed find half a voucher for \$59.94 in favor Leo Augrook for lightering supplies at Deering.

There was no contract with the Western Alaska S. S. Co., in regard to this shipment. They being the only boat to sail took our supplies at regular rates, ship's tackle Deering. Their entire freight for Deering, including Government goods and private shipments, were all loaded at one time on the lighters of a local company who as usual delivered all at the Deering store.

As they were to do the lightering of the S. S. "Navajo" at Kotzebue, they could not, or would not, segregate the Government goods from the private shipments and make a separate and special delivery at the Deering school for the reason that they had to sail with the steamship to Kotzebue. This is a legitimate charge and I think should be paid, and I trust you will be able to find funds with which to meet this bill, inasmuch as I have practically

nothing left in any of my authorizations.

You will note that only one half of a voucher is attached. This is all that we received at this office.
