Dear Friends:-

I am enclosing herewith Mrs. Replogle's check for the month of March. Here I am going to mention something that has been causing me some anxiety:- Does Mrs. Replogle sign her own voucher or has Mr. Replogle been doing it? You see the similarity in hand-writing has been responsible for my erroneous deductions relative to the signature at the bottom of her vouchers. ( See #6 of the "Instructions" at the back of the voucher.) The signature of a claimant, if by X must be witnessed.

I am forwarding Leo Augrook the check for the lightering of the Government supplies from the point of lighterage to the U. S. Government school, at Deering. I mailed the check to him at Kotzebue, with instructions to send you the money due the other boys who assisted him. I gave him a list of the amounts so that he would have no trouble. We allowed him the amount in full.

I suppose that this will be the last mail that you will get until after the opening of navigation, so you will have to wait for checks etc. until the first boat arrives. Best wishes for a prosperous summer.
