SUBJECT

At last we have had a days respite from a terrific storm which began the next day after your departure.

It has been such fierce weather that one day our school was reduced to only 32 scholars. We have often had you in mind during these days and wondered if you fared well. But have had our confidence strengthened by the knowledge of your splendid endurance test between Kotzebue and us.

The reindeer lost the morning you left, ^{us} have not been recovered except the sled deer of the Deering boys, and Andrew Green has now lost 2 of his deer. But returned to his home today. The mission boys from Kotzebue had one sled deer killed by dogs and one wounded, but he will recover. Am sending list and sizes of houses as complete as possible.
