Dear Mr. Replogle:-

Please hold the inclosed bills until the arrival of Supt. Shields and have him take the matter up with Robinson, Magids & Co. at Deering. I feel that this bill has been paid though I can find no memorandum to that effect. Perhaps Supt. Shields can give some light on the subject.

I hope that the gasoline lights are still doing good service and that you are well pleased with them, for a kerosene lamp is a poor light as compared with gas. I would hate to see or hear that teachers were not capable of running the lights or had accidents and in that way cause the removal of them. I was told that you had your's running the day after you received them.

I trust that you are all pleased with the field and that you can already see results in your municipality. For that is what it amounts to- a sort of a little colony with you and your wife as rulers, judges, advisors etc.
