


I am in receipt of your letter of October 26th, enclosing the bid of the S. S. "Corwin" for delivering freight from Teller to Wales, Shishmaref and Kotzebue, and shall use it in settling with the "Corwin" when they present their bills.

In reference to the lighterage of the Government supplies at Deering, since such delivery was from the village to the school would say that this should be paid out of Mr. Shields' Local Expense authorization and to this end a card, #85, has been issued giving him an additional \$110.00 for this lighterage and on account of the Sinuk freight.
