

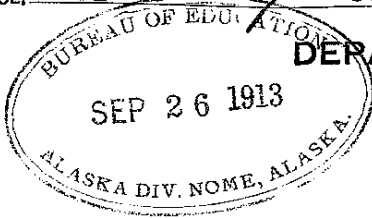

arrived alright via Corwin, it was very kind of you, in the midst of your rush of work to send them so promptly.. many thanks..

We find it to be impractical to keep the front of the school house open during the winter months and that the rear has been used entirely, which seems wise; but the rear steps are exposed almost entirely to the snow. only a rickety old shed, very open at that for protection. A letter from Mrs. Lopp to Miss, Hinnicent informs us we must have authority from the District Supt before we can alter any part of Gov. building. We wish to build a good permanent storm shed over the rear steps with one door facing the west and a transom window facing the south. also. = to make an opening 16 in high by 2 7/8 in.
