

Nome, Alaska. June 24, 1915.

Dear Mrs. Nichols:

My records show that your checks for May, June and July were cashed during the fall and have already been noted by the Treasury Department. They did not notify me who had indorsed them but I trust that the people that you mailed them to have notified you that all is well. If you have not heard anything relative to this matter kindly let me know and I will have the Department look up the indorsers.

We expect Miss Hawk out on the first boat, and Tom still calls up Haaorrkk-k-k. He is getting along splendidly.

Mr. Shields is at present on the Bear. They will stop at St. Lawrence, Siberia, Diomedes, Wales and Teller before they return. That is if the ice permits.

Have had rather a damp summer so far but I am looking for the sun to break through the clouds any time now. Wild flowers are blooming but not very plentiful.

Tell the Doctor that we will be very short on medical this year. Had to send out for some drugs etc. to carry us through the fiscal year.
