My dear Mrs. Cox :

It is my present plan to leave here about the middle of November, going to Golovin, Council and Candle. From there I shall probably go to Selawik and then to Kotzebue. I hope to be able to get as far North as Point Hope.

I am looking forward to this trip with a great deal of pleasure. Ever since I came to Alaska I have been expecting to get away from Nome for a trip, and at last I seem to be able to do so. I shall probably reach Kotzebue about the middle of December, and shall make it my headquarters for a little while. I have mailed several packages to myself in your care and would ask you to hold my mail for me.

You and Miss Mac Leod should not mail any of your vouchers to Nome, but hold them as I will pay them when I reach Kotzebue. Anything else that you wish from Nome will be attended to by Mr. Walter Johnson.
