The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Mrs Nichols call the roll and twenty-seven members answered.

We all stood up and thanked Mrs Ahnemaynuk and Mrs Kooteok for they clean Mrs Tulacocksick's house when her little boy died. We talk about club rules and Mrs Kagoona want us to all try to be pure in our lives and to help all the other women to be pure too. We all stand up to tell that we want that for a club rule. We promise to try to be better wives and better mothers. We promise to wash our bodies and our hair and our clothes and to wash the bodies and hair and clothes of all our family.

We promise to chase lice and not to let them stop on our bodies, on our heads or in our houses. We promise to have clean houses and to try to keep them tidy. We will try to have boxes, shelves, hooks and cupboards in our houses so our things will not be left upon the floor. Another club rule is to wash our dishes every time anyone use them and to have each person use their own dishes and not eat from same seal oil dish. Another rule is that we will try to wash our hands beforr we touch food. And everyone stand up to tell that they want these for our club rules.

After that Mrs Nichols said to us to go out in the fresh air. School house is not good to stay in too long.

Frances Hensley and Blanche Lincoln were visitors from the reindeer camp. Meeting adourned with singing Goodnight Ladies.
