I am sending you on this mail the financial report of the Nilima children, also the belated reports of the reindeer herds.

Lam sorry that they were not made out sooner but it was simply out
of the question to get them done this summer. There were a good many

times this summer when I failed to find time for either eating or sleep
ngwith any regularity. I went at one time for two days and three

nights straight without stopping to sleep, and that was on top of some

three or four nights of about fours hours sleep each.

Between lawsuits, the regular mission work, and the building of the church: it sometimes has been a question of whether I was going or coming, or again at times whether I was not doing both at the same.

Now the greatest rush is over. The village has dwindled to about its usual winter size. The church building has all the outside work doneand a part of the inside work is under way. We had been holding services in it some time before Miss Hawk returned.

Miss Hunnicutt and Miss Stratton have been with us for a couple of weeks and have been a great help. As soon as it is safe trivelling they in tend going up the Noatak for at least a part of the winter.

I am also enclosing a copy of the letter that I wrote to Mr. T.L. Brevig, U.S.

Peller, Alaska. If this is not sufficient and the attorney can let me

know of anything further that needs to be done and that I can do, I will be glad to do it. I have resigned as Commissioer, but as yet have not

eard from judge Tucker since sending him my resignation and Commission.

I am sending not sure that I ever answered your question regarding the two half trips that were made with the mail last spring. It was on secunt of the bad condition of the trail we fully expected to send mail back next to the last trip, but the carrier said he had orders not to take
