Your vouchers at hand and they will receive attention as soon as possible.

The one you issued for cash furnished in connection with a white man. Wisson I believe, can not be handeled by this department. In fact only in cases of extreme necessity do we furnish medicine from the Government supplies. I make the last remark on account of a note on the back of your report in which you state that you had treated a certain number of cases that were not Eskimos. In regards to the cash that you advanced I feel that you will eventually get it back for I took the matter up with the Department of Justice and they have a found that is used in cases of destitution among the whites. I enclose a couple of blanks, I have also put the proper paryies on the mans trail and he will receive blanks. After he recieve his relief money he should reimburse you for cash advanced Write him and also the Candle people.

Any work of this nature is of course done on your own responsibility, the same as private or personal affairs.
