My dear Mrs. Cox:

Your three letters of Aug. 25th are received, and in reply, I beg to say that the several boxes of chalk will be sent to you through the mail. *sent Sept 2/11*

An authorization for fuel will also be sent you with which you can purchase the necessary wood for kindling.

Regarding the Bureau furnishing material for making clothing for the school children would say that it is the policy of the Department to furnish only such material as is needed for models or patterns as dresses, aprons, handkerchiefs and such other articles as are needed by the natives in improving the condition of their clothing or their homes, so that only a limited amount would be sent in response to your request. In making out your requisition, I would suggest that you confine it to gingham for aprons for the industrial classes, calico for dresses, toweling, material for handkerchiefs and other materials along that line.
