Dear Doctor:-

Enclosed are a few checks that I trust you will have no trouble in seeing that they get to the proper parties. I am unable to pay for the hauling of the freight, at present, for I do not wish to pay that amount from your medical. I have wired Mr. Lopp for a special authorization to cover the whole amount, coal and all. Expect to hear from him soon. Be sure to send contracts for these expenditures, with the vouchers. You neglected to send one with your transportation to Kiana and return? Please make one out and state the number of miles, as near as possible. Also always state the articles that you have purchased and what the price of each is. I am paying both of your transportation vouchers although I will hold them for your contract with Lester Gallahorn. The voucher for subsistence, (1.00) one dollar is just as important that you name the articles as if it were for \$1000.00. The Treasurer honors one the same as the other. Below is a transcript of your account as it
