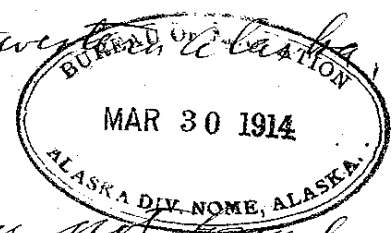

Mrs. Nichols says I am not formal enough in the way I address my business letters to you, so here goes one to please my wife.

I am assigning my March salary check to Schwabacher Brothers of Seattle. I do not suppose there is any use in sending the assignment blank to you before the voucher sent, but not knowing I will send it, I am sending an ~~memorandum~~ copy of the assignment blank to Schwabacher Brothers, all made out. I do not know whether they will collect from it or whether they will have to wait till after you can get word to the Seattle office after receiving my voucher which I suppose cannot go through your office till after the completion of the month.

Look for my medical reports for the months of Jan, Feb + March on the next mail from Kotzebue. I was unable to make out Jan. + Feb. at the time when due on account of being on the trail. Since returning I have been unable to get caught up as yet. COPY
