Since my return from the outside I have been kept pretty hard at work, what with storms and reindeer matters (which are much alike in their ability to breed trouble) I am sorry that I have not written to be before this. For a while I had expected to come to Kotzebue just as soon as possible but have now decided to wait until after Christmas. I should reach Kotzebue near the end of January.

I have given Dr Nichols an order for all the mail. He is to look it over and to forward some of it and to hold the rest for my arrival.

You should form a very delightful social circle at Kotzebue this year and I am sure that the work at the Mission and the School is going on well. Please give my greetings to the natives.
