I am sorry that I could not forward your salary for Aug. at the same time that I am sending your wife's but your amount being incorrect I will need a new assignment and voucher before I can pay. I enclose \$50.00 for Mrs. Nichols.

There is not a stove in town, of the same make that the range you wish repaired. I suggest that you send me the measurements and I will forward you sheet of steel. Perhaps a new grate was ordered from Seattle and it may come with your supplies. I want you to send a new list of medical supplies that you will need so that I can attend to it before the last boat.

Mr. Shields will arrive the last of this month and then I will know how much money can be spent on Kotzebue Medical. You do not need to feel worried about asking for things, - every school does that, - but you can feel a little worried about getting them. None get all they want and seldom all they ask for.

Miss Anderson is teaching and I have to do my own stenographic work as you can plainly see by the errors. If you can't decipher or understand, get some native, they can read anything.
