I am not able to give you any information about your typewriter at present. I believed that Mr. Warner took it on the Corwin and supposed that it had been delivered to you I shall do all I can to locate it for you.

Your salary vouchers have been forwarded to Seattle today. They are for the time between July 1 and Nov. 30, 1911. I was informed by Mr. Sinclair that his office held your assignment covering the period from July 1 to Dec. 30. I do not know whether they were assigned to Schwabacher or not. All assignments to parties outside are paid by the Seattle office, and I have no detailed records of such matters. Mr. Sinclair will no doubt write you about the Montgomery ward shipment and the insurance of your goods.
