My Dear Mr. Hoove:

In checking up the Point Hope inventory, I find that Mr. Sickler refers to the list of building materials loaned to you three years ago from the Government school supplies, and lists them as not returned. This probably means that the materials in question were shipped by your society on the Steamer St. Helens in 1910, or the Schooner F. S. Redfields in 1911. As neither of these shipments reached Point Hope, I presume your Society recovered the insurance on them, and since Captain Backlund of the Schooner Transit tells me he has no such shipment aboard, I presume the matter has been overlooked.

Mr. A. H. Horton tells me he thinks the goods in question were sent up on the St. Helens.
