Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of March 5th, regarding three fox skins which you sent to this office during 1914.

Your three skins were sent out, along with 64 other fox skins belonging to Barrow natives, under date of February 24, 1914. They were received here June 26, 1914, and on July 25, 1914, I sent checks to cover all the sales of the same to Mr. Richardson, at Barrow. Your skins sold for \$37.00, which minus the commission of \$1.85, made a net return of \$35.15. Check for this amount was made out in your name. The check has never been turned in at the bank, so possibly Mr. Richardson is still trying to reach you to deliver the check to you. I am sending a copy of this letter to Mr. Richardson, at Barrow, in order that he may communicate with you if the check has not already gotten to you.
