Dear Sir :

I enclose herewith requisition and inventory from Wainwright which has been checked by me. You will note that this requisition is unusually small for such a large school in such an isolated position.

I note that Mr. Van Valin has made no requisition for any fuel supplies, nor has he written me anything about the fuel situation at Wainwright. However, as it is important that we develop the mine at Wainwright, and if possible supply other schools from it, I believe that you should send Wainwright the usual supply of barter goods. I do not know what was sent last year so am unable to suggest any list of supplies but I believe it would be satisfactory to duplicate the last order if we do not hear from Wainwright later on this subject.

I regret that again this year no provision seems to have been made for a third copy of the inventory for this office.
