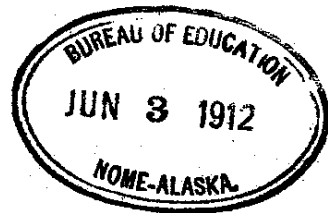

Dear Sir:

You will please deliver to Captain Backland of the Schooner Transit, the following articles shown to be at Point Hope in the inventory, dated December, 1911, and take a receipt from Captain Backland for them:

About 2,000 feet of T. & G. Ceiling,

260 " " 2 x 6,

34 " " Crown Molding.

In your inventory you also speak of certain articles that have been loaned to the Episcopal Mission at Point Hope from the Government School supplies. These included shingles, ceiling, paint, etc. These articles were loaned to the Episcopal Mission on my order, with the understanding that they were to be returned the following year. Since they have not been returned, it is probably due to their inability to have them forwarded. I understand they were on the Schooner Redfield when she was wrecked at Cape Prince of Wales. If these shingles
