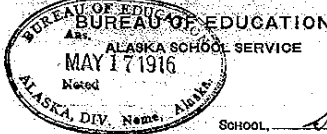

Mr. Shields, I'm sending you a letter from Geo. R. Crissman, Supt. of the Training School Department of the State Normal School, Warrensburg, Missouri. I did kindergarten work under Mr. Crissman's supervision when I was in school in Missouri.

In March 1915 I had many of my children at Noatak write letters to the children of the Training School. I am glad he can speak as he does in regard to my children's penmanship, spelling and use of English. When the children come from the coast I'll give them their letters and have them answer. They are also writing to children in Portland. They are very proud when their letters come.

If you please, I would like Mr. Crissman's letter returned. I thought possibly you, also, would be pleased to know what he says of our children's work.
