Our checks for the month of November arrived. Thanks to you. We were sorry to put you to so much extra trouble, but it was very necessary that we have them sent up here this time. I'm sure you are overcrowded with work.

Your letter of Dec. 13 regarding Mr. Lopez's message about furs just reached us. Thus far we have bought one white fox from Tom Berryman - \$8.60 - and sent to Miss Angela Warren, 355 Chapman St., Portland, Oregon, one mink - \$1.00 - sent to Mrs. C.C. Hayden, 112 East 16th St., Pittsburg, Kansas, and one bear skin - \$4.00 - sent to Mrs. Char. E. Garstang, 837 So. Vermont St., Los Angeles, California; one

weasel - 25¢ - which we have our-
selves. The mink and weasel were
bought from Shootluk, Noatak, and
the bear skin from Paul Davidvic.

One of our natives, Kaliksoona (Jev.
Booth) has ordered to come in with our
supplies, 300 pounds of flour, 400 pounds
of sugar, 100 pounds of rice, 60 pounds
of lard. Our order which included this
was sent out before your letter of Dec. 12th
reached us, otherwise we would have
sent the order to Mr. Lopp and advanced
the money ourselves for the native.
We will take a receipt from the native
showing the amount paid for each article
and the freight paid and send the receipt
to you to be forwarded to Mr. Lopp.
