

ST. MICHAEL RECORDING PRECINCT.

COMMENCING at a point on the shore of Norton Bay situated at the southern limit of the Inglatalik River watershed; thence easterly and northerly along the southern summit of the Inglatalik River watershed to a point of intersection with the summit dividing the watersheds draining into Norton Bay towards the west and draining into the Yukon River towards the east (this line is identical with the boundary line of Koyuk Precinct); thence southerly along the summit dividing the watersheds draining into Norton Bay and Norton Sound towards the west and draining into the Yukon River towards the east to a point on the summit between the headwaters of Unalaklik and Autokakat Rivers; thence easterly and southerly along the northern summit of the Autokakat River watershed; thence southerly and westerly along the center line of the main channel of the Yukon River through the southern channel of and at the mouth of the said Yukon River to a point of intersection with the coast line of Bering Sea; thence northeasterly along the coast of Bering Sea, Norton Sound and Norton Bay to place of beginning.

Embracing all of that ground or land draining into Norton Bay between the southern limit of the Inglatalik River watershed and Cape Denbigh; all of that ground or land draining into Norton Sound and Bering Sea between Cape Denbigh and the mouth of the southern channel (outlet) of the Yukon River; all of that ground or land draining into the Yukon River from the west between the mouth of the

southern channel (outlet) of the said Yukon River and the northern limit of Autokakat River watershed; and also including St. Michaels Island, Stewart Island, Egg Island, Besboro Island and all of the islands at the mouth of the Yukon River lying north of the southern channel.
