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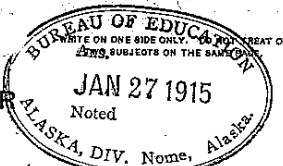
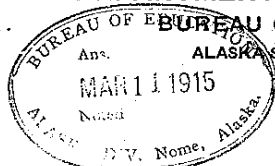

Dear Sir:

During the storm which lasted several days after Thanksgiving some of our deer probably fifteen or twenty strayed from the herd and have been missing since that time.

The herders have looked for them in the vicinity of the old camp and have been to Sealing Point to the summer feeding grounds looking for them.

Henry, Arthur, and Wilson are going to start for Sealing Point today to look for the deer.

That will leave Paul Monroe and John Adams to take care of the herd and Legume to go for the mail.

Our mail service in this way is certainly poor. I am making a special effort to get the deer together at the new camp fourteen miles North-West of Noatak.
