Enclosed you will find a check of \$10.00 for Teglock. He is the man you hired to bank up the schoolhouse. I trust he did a good job of it and that you will be able to save more than the amount of this expenditure in fuel this next winter.

Your voucher was O. K. except that you neglected to state why you did not advertise for this work. I filled the blank of the voucher in with "4" in the first space and "C" in the second, and then on the back of the voucher under "4", I wrote, "Work given to worthy native" and under "C", I wrote, "oral". These blanks should be filled in so that the vouchers will not be held up for not advertising for the work done.
