

Dear Sir:

Mr. Johnson did me a great favor in purchasing the Kodak which arrived on the freighter safe and sound.

I believe my April voucher must be ready for payment by this time. I assigned it to you because it often happens that cash is very hard to get in such large quantities at Kotzebue early in the season.

I am assigning you my June vouchers also for two reasons. The first is that if it must go outside and come back again it will not be paid until I go up the river. Then I wish you would register the money to me. I am trying
