My dear Mr. Jones:

Upon receipt of your letter of Aug. 9th. regarding the shortage on Chas. Coffin's goods landed at Kotzebue, I took the matter up with the representative of the Western Alaska Steamship Co. here. I enclose his letter in reply. As you will see he states that they have a receipt for the entire shipment from the Lighterage Company. However, he stated to me that he had spoken to Mr. Dankert himself and that Mr. Dankert stated that he had some extra xkx sugar which he would be willing to turn over to Coffin to make good the shortage.

I am sending this letter to Doctor Barbour with the suggestion that he do anything in his power to help the matter along. I suppose you have gone up the river by this time. All papers are enclosed.
