Kind Friend, we are as busy as ever and I know you are the same. I have sixty five logs here for the dwelling I allowed the Eskimos one deer for 6 logs there are more less than you ask for and 24 and 28 ft long as I have the plans I can't tell what it will take only the flooring $20 \times 24 = 480 + 120 = 600$ ft I don't know how they want the joists so I can't tell how many will be needed the same way with the balance of material we used the rest of the flooring and ceiling to reced the shed building so we can't count on any of that for dwelling we need the flooring for

we will want about 300 No 8th finishing nails
we need almost all that is here for ceiling
Partitions and side Board, and plenty of stung
nails as we have none of them, also
plenty of terracotta pipe for we will
have to put an extra chimney in the
schoolhouse for the cooking department

Send about 15 extra rolls of paper for
baster for work as the natives would like
like paper for their cabins. Our baster
flour and sugar is all those that worked
in the school building took flour and sugar
for their work so you see flour sugar coffee
tea Lard Bacon some salt in 2nd st^h Beans Rice
and a few boxes Pilot Bread are the principle things
they want for work

I would like if you would send about 2 dozen 2ⁱⁿ
brass hinges for side Board doors and Bins for the
same amount of putty and tenn or
twelve 2 1/2ⁱⁿ hinges for ward robe doors
Have the window and door frames sent
as knocked down, window frames for not less
than a 10ⁱⁿ wall and an inch ^{and} a half
thick so we do not have to splice them to make
them wide enough
