My Dear Mr. Evers. I will tell you our experience of feeding the Reindeer we had two brought in they ate any thing we gave them we fed them rolled Oats, rice, bread and the scraps from the table one of them lived three days the other one seemed to do pretty well as we gave him some moss but I think the other one would have died also if we would not give it some moss. our loss was pretty heavy this spring but they are doing nicely now.

I believe if they want to feed deer it would well to send some chop feed such as corn and oats and send a small cutting box and gather some moss and chop it fine and mix with corn and oats until they

get used to the grain as a food I believe they could be learned to eat it and do well on it without moss. now this feed is only a supposition of mine. I am sorry that you did not get my letter regarding Mr. Reich's freight as I sent you a letter explaining what we done on the february mail so you would be sure to get it on your way back from the north. I am sending you a copy of the letter I wrote you, and also sent the one letter to you by Lewis Reich so you would be sure and get one of them. We have our garden all planted and is coming up nicely. we are sending some pictures of the garden and school house and the logs after they are sawed for house. Mrs Myers & Pauline with me send our best regards to you.
