Dear Sir,

I hav recieved your letter of Nov, 30,1914, and wish to thank you for the pains you have taken to secure the payment of the men who worked on the house. Er Lloyd says that he is willing to walt at the men who worked on the house. At Ployd says that he is willing to wait at your convenience, for his payment, and that next year will be the same to him as he is in no hurry for the money. John and Charley are in the Koyukuk where they have taken reindeer. I am afraid that perhaps I have given you to understand that the house had been "Completed", which however is not the case. The 2nd story needs to be ceiled, partitioned into rooms, and papered. There was also not enough paper to cover the partition walls downstairs. The wife down are a medley of different sixed sashes. dows are a medley of different sized saches , panes, etc. I hope this material

may be sent us.

We are enjoying weather that is 40 below, and the house stands the tests

O.K. We have also had some very strong winds, and did not feel them.

We have Dr Nichols with us. He has developed in o a good musher since lest year. He has been of considerable help to me but not to the extent that he would have been had he been able to have come up when I first wrote for him.
When you come please bring all the 1st class maill for Shungnak. I have heard nothing concerning our postoffice and we have had some auful experiences

in sending and recieving mail this winter.
We are all well and hope that you and yours are the same. I still have a big school but many families are preparing to visit the Hot Springs, and

this will cut down the average considerable.

When you are at Kivalina, I wish you would try to collect\$30 .00 due me from Chester Downey (Sevik). If you cannot get cash perhaps you could arrange to have him give the Govt. a deer at Kivalina, and I could get a Govt. deer to butched from this herd.
