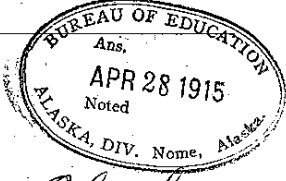

he had been nearly frozen to death. I presume this is why he has not come.

Mr. & Mrs. Replogle has written for us to come over to Kivalina when our natives leave for Sealing Point. We have decided to do this and stay until I can get things fixed up at Sealing Point. Our people will soon be gone. We will get to Kotzebue as early as possible.

Everything is going very nicely.

I will just write a few lines before we start to Kivalina as the sleds are all packed and waiting. Peter came last night. He was entirely satisfied with your decision regarding the number of deer he will get. The dogs are gone with the herd to Sealing Point, and Laganne & Paul are here to take

us to Kivilinga. We leave this afternoon. Peter is gone to the herd to butcher a deer and go back to Ockie for his family.

He will leave his sheep with the herd at Sealing Point until his return.

I think it is by far the best plan to go to Kivilinga for about three weeks and then to Sealing Point.

Mr. Shields I will pay you for the use of your money if you or Mr. Johnson will cable \$2000 to Mrs. H. Chase, Secy. Masonic Life Association, Masonic Temple, Buffalo, N.Y.

It is for one of my insurance policies that I thought I had left ample provision for the payment of, before I left Portland, Ore. For some reason that I do not understand the money has not been paid as I directed and I am very anxious not to lose the policy.
