

- Aakwtaatseen (á kw tát sēn'): the main character in Kiksadi Dog Salmon Legend
- Ahnyuddi (án yə' dē): high caste or "town" Tlingit
- Chookaneidee (chōō kən ā' dē): an Eagle clan
- Dakl'aweidee (dākl wā' dē): an Eagle clan
- Deisheetaan (dā shē tán'): a Raven clan
- Eulachon (hōō' ɬ gən): a small, oily fish of the smelt family
- Gaanax.adee (gā nāch ā' dē: German ch): A Raven clan
- Haida (hī' də): A group of Northwest Coast Indians inhabiting parts of Southeastern Alaska and British Columbia
- Ixt'(icht: German ch): shaman
- Ishkahittaaan (ish kə hit tán'): A Raven clan
- Kahtahah (kə tā' ä): the heroine of the book by that name
- Kaach.adee (kāch ā' dē): A Raven clan
- Kaagwaantaan (käg wān tán'): An Eagle clan
- Kiks. adi (kiks ā' dē): A Raven clan
- Kwaashk'i Kwaan (kwash ki kwān'): A Raven clan
- Kwakiutl (kwā gooł'): a group of Northwest Coast Indians inhabiting parts of the coast of British Columbia
- Kuiu (kōō'yōō): one of the original Tlingit villages in Southeastern Alaska
- Naanyaa.aayee (nān yā' ā' yē): an Eagle clan
- Shangukeidee (shān gōō kā' dē): an Eagle clan
- Stikine (sti kēn'): a river in Southeastern Alaska
- Sukteeneidee (sōōk tē nā' dē): a Raven clan
- T'akdeintaan (tāk dān tán'): a Raven clan
- Teey Hit Taan (tē hit tán'): a Raven clan (Kahtahah's clan)

Teikweidee (tāk wā'dē): an Eagle clan

Tlingit (Zin git'): often pronounced "klink' it" because the initial sound does not occur in English. It is a "barred L," which is a voiceless sound produced by placing the tongue in a position to say an "L," and then blowing out both sides of the tongue. In the Tlingit language, the accent occurs on the second, rather than the first syllable.

Tsaagweidee (tsā gwā' dē): an Eagle clan

Tsimshian (tsim shē an): a group of Northwest Coast Indians inhabiting the coast and river systems of northern British Columbia, and Annette Island in Southeastern Alaska.

Wooshketaan (wōōsh kē tān'): an Eagle clan

Yanyeidee (yān yā' dē): an Eagle clan
