Aakwtaatseen (â kw tät sen'): the main character in <u>Kiksadi Dog</u> Salmon <u>Legend</u>

Ahnyuddi (an yo'dē): high caste or "town" Tlingit

Chookaneidee (choo kon ā' dē): an Eagle clan

Dakl'aweidee (däkl wā' dē): an Eagle clan

Deisheetaan (da she tan'): a Raven clan

Eulachon (hoo' lo gon): a small, oily fish of the smelt family

Gaanax.adee (ga nach a' de: German ch): A Raven clan

Haida (hī' də): A group of Northwest Coast Indians inhabiting parts of Southeastern Alaska and British Columbia

Ixt'(icht: German ch): shaman

Ishkahittaan (ish ka hit tan'): A Raven clan

Kahtahah (ka ta' a): the heroine of the book by that name

Kaach.adee (kach a' de): A Raven clan

Kaagwaantaan (käg wan tän'): An Eagle clan

Kiks. adi (kiks å' de): A Raven clan

Kwaashk'i Kwaan (kwash ki kwan'): A Raven clan

Kwakiutl (kwa gool'): a group of Northwest Coast Indians inhabiting parts of the coast of British Columbia

Kuiu (koo'yoo): one of the original Tlingit villages in Southeastern Alaska

Naanyaa.aayee (nan ya a' ye): an Eagle clan

Shangukeidee (shan goo ka' de): an Eagle clan

Stikine (sti ken'): a river in Southeastern Alaska

Sukteeneidee (sook të na' de): a Raven clan

T'akdeintaan (täk dän tän'): a Raven clan

Teey Hit Taan (te hit tan'): a Raven clan (Kahtahah's clan)

Teikweidee (tak wa'de): an Eagle clan

Thingit (Iin git'): often pronounced "klink' it" because the initial sound does not occur in English. It is a "barred L," which is a voiceless sound produced by placing the tongue in a position to say an "L," and then blowing out both sides of the tongue. In the Thingit language, the accent occurs on the second, rather than the first syllable.

Tsaagweidee (tså gwā' dē): an Eagle clan

Tsimshian (tsim she an): a group of Northwest Coast Indians inhabiting the coast and river systems of northern British Columbia, and Annette Island in Southeastern Alaska.

Wooshketaan (woosh ke tan'): an Eagle clan Yanveidee (yan ya' de): an Eagle clan
